First participants encouraged to for organization; put on classified meetings for military operations analysts from services, industry & academia

Incorporated as non-profit professional society

For many years did 2 symposia a year

In 1980s, went to one big symposium per year plus special meetings

Membership:

Members, dues paying, open

Directors: 28 voting (elected by BoD; uniformed serving officers, DoD civilians, industry & academia), 2 non-voting (CEO & immediate past president)

Fellows: 65 living, 13 deceased

Not a good year; budget matters related to sequestration affected programs; a number of workshops postponed. No waivers from DoD sponsors, etc.

Annual symposium scheduled for US Military Academy, West Point, shifted at last moment to hotel in Alexandria, VA; limited space reduced participants from over 1,000 expected to about 300; 600 presentations reduced to about 200.

Creative establishment of on-line symposium experiment, used DoD meeting system. 3 days of presentations: 2 unclassified & 1 Secret level. Friday: about 30 papers and over 100 participants; Saturday only 3 papers & about a dozen listeners. More virtual meetings planned.
